Scripture: Genesis 2: 4-25

- 2) Look at verse 1:25. What does it mean that we are made in "the image of God"? Talk about an image as a picture or likeness.
- 3) Look again at verse 2: 8, 15. Where did God place the man and what was to be his task? How is that still or task?
- 4) What was Adam given to eat? What was forbidden? A covenant is a promise of relationship between God and people. God gives to his people and his people are expected to respond. What did God give to Adam? What did God expect in return? (that Adam would not eat from the tree of Knowledge)
- 5) What was the man lacking? What did God provide first for Adam?
- 6) Why did Adam still lack a partner after naming all the animals? Read again slowly the story of how God created Eve in 2:20-25. How are man and woman part of each other? How does Adam feel about Eve? What does he say?

- 4) Look again at Genesis 3: 7, 8. Why did they sew fig leaves together? Why did they hide from God? Have you even seen someone hide when they did something wrong? (This could be an animal or a person.)
